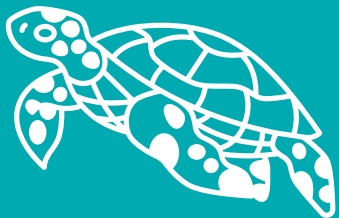

## 5. Carbon

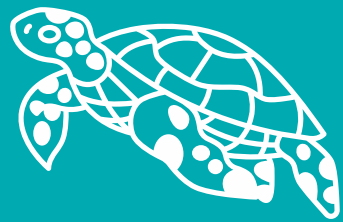


**Measure carbon emissions to establish baseline emissions and commit to appropriate near and long-term science-based targets (SBTs) to reduce emissions in line with climate science.**

**\*Science-based targets (SBTs) represent credible and validated decarbonisation ambitions, to limit global temperature increase to 1.5°C.**

**\*Members' SBTs should be appropriate to their business context and be stated with reference to their baseline carbon footprint.**

## 6. Nature Exploitation



**Mandate that all customers avoid nature exploiting souvenirs, e.g. ivory, tortoise shell, corals.**

**Reduce the time clients / customers spend in over touristed / overexploited natural areas.**

**Support local or supplier initiatives to protect and restore biodiversity.**

**Engage young people in the importance of conserving our natural world.**
